Both buyers and sellers are using social media apps, harder for law enforcement to encrypt.

Most of the laws are similar and some states that have made Kratom illegal have reversed legislation. American Kratom Association has a lot of funding and lobbies for Kratom initiatives. Seeing stiffer sentences when it comes to Kratom. A big organization that sells Kratom is Grow LLC I am not sure if they are a partner to Happy Hippo. (Kendall) Showed free samples from Happy Hippo. (Anne) No law they are complying to when it comes to carding. (Kati) It would be interesting to know if Kratom is illegal in states where marijuana is illegal or legal. (Kendall) There are only a few states that have regulations. Happy Hippo explained harms on the packet and set the age restriction to purchase their products as 21 or older.
